TITLE: MonopoListic Competition: Recent and Next Developments

DESCRIPTION

The Dixit-Stiglitz Monopolistic Competition model with CES preferences has been influential in many areas of applied general equilibrium, including macroeconomics, international trade, economic geography, economic growth and innovation dynamics. In this lecture series, I will first cover *recent* developments in the theory of monopolistic competition with non-CES preferences. Then, I will discuss some applications of monopolistic competition *with* CES preferences, and speculate how some of these results in this literature may change with non-CES, which I predict will be *next* developments in monopolistic competition.
